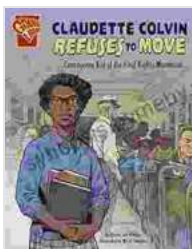


# Claudette Colvin: The Trailblazing Teen Who Sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott

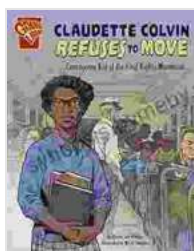
